EPQ

As part of the diverse range of academic opportunities that RHS Sixth Form offers, students are able to take the EPQ



(Extended Project Qualification) which is a standalone qualification taken alongside your other subjects. Unlike other local sixth forms, we offer this opportunity for free, to all students (some colleges charge up to £100 to enter!) You may be asking: what does the EPQ really involve or how do you know if it is the right choice for you? So, we put together a handy guide:

- A 5000 word independent piece of writing or a creative 'artefact' that you have made.
- The EPQ is worth up to 26 UCAS points.
- It is highly regarded by both universities and employers.
 You choose the topic and project title essentially giving you the opportunity to turn your hobby into UCAS points!
 You can develop research and writing skills that will help your
- other subjects and is good practice for university.
- · Receive invaluable help with the process from your project adviser.
- Adds interest to your personal statement.

You will receive teaching and guidance to get you started, to help with planning, researching and presentation skills, and to keep you on track as you work through your chosen project. When you have completed the project, you will present your work to a panel who want to hear about your research process and findings.
