Dear Parents/Guardians

Attendance initiative

We are running an attendance initiative to promote strong attendance right up until the end of term. As students and parents/guardians will be aware, we continue with teaching and learning right until the end of the term, so it's vitally important that students attend until the last day to ensure they have every chance of attaining their full potential. We will be running the '12 days of Christmas' attendance initiative. Essentially, the way it works is that students will receive a digital raffle ticket for every day that they attend school for the final 12 days of the term.
